A new method for handling issues arising under the new CIO-Pine Industrial Relations committee labor agreement, agreed upon during recent union-employer negotiations and termed a workable, reasonable solution by representatives of both factions, was revealed to-

The method was proposed by ne PIRC in a meeting with the union on May 20 and formally accepted in a later session.

It provides that all disputes be settled, if possible, between each employer and his employes' plant committee. If agreement shall be referred, if either side requests it, to the PIRC and the Klamath basin district council of the CIO International Woodworkers of America for handling.
Written request for PIRC and

council handling must be made within five days of final disa-

greement. Both the PIRC and the district council, will thereupon be authorized, through representatives each may designate, to seek an amicable settlement.

The agreement provides that ormal operation shall not be interfered with and no strike, lockout or other stoppage shall be permissable until seven days after either the PIRC or the district council has given written notice to the disputants that they are unable to agree upon a settlement.
