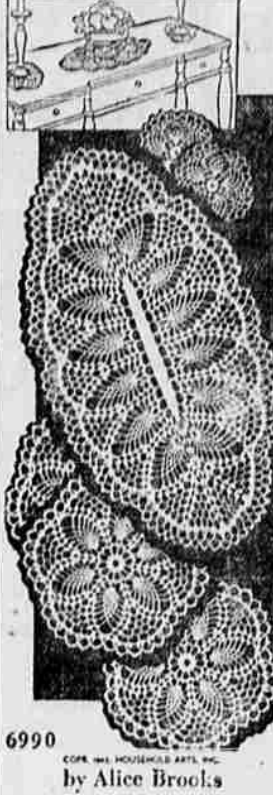

cliffe, Mrs. Harold Shaffer, Mrs. Richard Hibbs and Hazel Morrison.

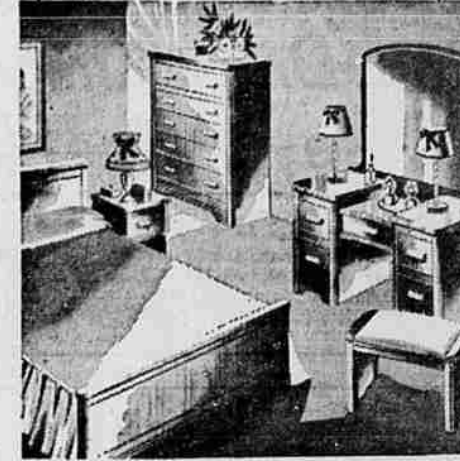

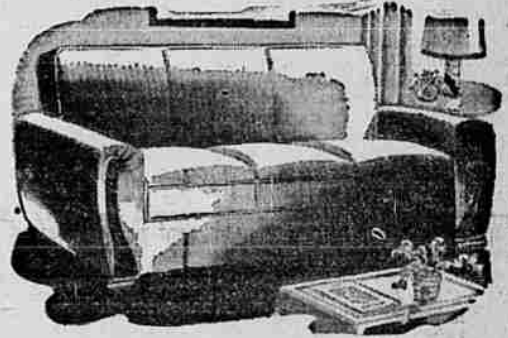

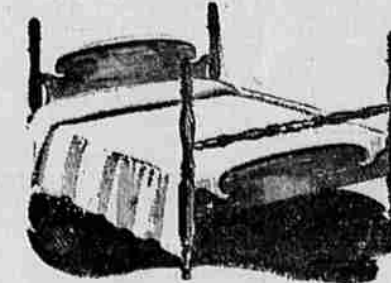
