In a raid July 4 on the White Cloud airfield near Canton also was reported.

The Japanese have closed the last gap in the Kiangsi-Chekking railroad, gaining complete control of that segment of the overland supply route they are attempting to stretch from Shanghai to Singapore, a Chinese army spokesman acknowledged today.

He said the Japanese finally wrested the rail line from the Chinese July 1. This bore out Japan's claim, made that day.

gan and 25 of the 28 others arrested Tuesday charge conspiracy to evade the selective service act, conspiracy to counsel bund members to resist service in the U. S. armed forces or conspiracy to conceal bund membership in registering as aliens. In the case of Kunze, espionage also is charged.

**Plead Innocent**

In New York, seven of those under indictment, including Gustav Elmer, bund national treasurer, pleaded innocent before Federal Judge George Sweeney and were held in bonds totaling \$85,000.

An eighth, John August Grill, pleaded guilty and Judge Sweeney postponed his sentencing until after the trial of the seven others, set for July 28.

Grill is liable to a sentence of five years and a fine of \$10,000 for conspiracy to interfere with the carrying out of the draft laws, and two years and a \$10,000 fine for conspiracy to obstruct the registration of aliens affiliated with the bund.

Fifteen women were among the 84 prisoners taken in Manhattan, Brooklyn and Long Island communities and in New Jersey.

In Glassboro, N. J., Mrs. Anna Schmidt, a German-born alien, collapsed and died of a cerebral hemorrhage and hypertension after being questioned in her home by an FBI agent.

## City Makes Last Push for Scrap Rubber

in Klamath Falls, following a general Pacific coast closure, were closed from noon until 6 o'clock today while attendants and managers made a house-to-house canvass.

Snodgrass said that all Klamath oil dealers and service station operators will make a last-minute all-out push tomorrow with 30 trucks combing the city. Stations and distributors' offices will maintain only skeleton crews, he said, during most of Friday afternoon.

No stations will be closed, however, Snodgrass said.

The campaign chairman, noting recent complaints that Main street merchants were hanging on to rubber floor mats where their necessity was questionable, asserted that he had looked at the mats and found them to be largely cord fabric and metal reinforcing rods with very little rubber.

He said the mats would yield so little rubber that it would be unfeasible to turn them in.

SALEM, July 9 (AP)—Oregon citizens should make an all-out effort immediately to uncover any amounts of rubber, Claude I. Sersanous, chairman of the state salvage committee, said today.

He said that Oregon, which now is in second place in the per capita collections, should be in first place when the final tally is made.

Sersanous said he suspects that many persons are hoarding scrap rubber in hopes of getting higher prices.

## AFL, CIO ASK PAY BOOST IN AIRCRAFT

tend that there must be an increase in aircraft wages or shipyard and other lucrative war trades will pull workers away. Management representatives have expressed willingness to consider pay raises, but today's figures were the first submitted.

The CIO-United Automobile Workers simultaneously issued this statement:

**Reaction**

"If the results of this conference do not provide the necessary relief then the UAW-CIO views with alarm the reaction of the aircraft workers."

Accompanying the wage demands was a joint statement from labor leaders that their policy provided that all workers remain in their present jobs pending outcome of the conference, and that there shall be no strike or slowdown in defense industries for duration of the war.

The unions also requested establishment of joint labor-management committees in each plant as a means of speeding up production.

## State Vocational Training Offers Fine Trade Study

An unprecedented opportunity for free training in any one of several trades is offered both men and women of Klamath Falls through the state division of vocational training. Those completing the courses are assured of jobs in war industries with excellent pay, according to A. H. Fitch, defense coordinator, with headquarters at Klamath Union high school.

New quotas have been assigned Klamath Falls to help meet the need for trained workers in the state, and Fitch urges anyone even vaguely interested to visit the shops at any time or contact the U. S. employment services offices, phone 3193 or his office at the high school, phone 7593.

Classes now offered at the high school both day and night, the quota assigned to Klamath Falls, average number of hours training required, specific requirements and prevailing wages for each type of work follow:

General sheet metal, quota 40, 360 hours required, mechanical experience preferred, 18-65 years old, rate of pay \$1.37 1/2 per hour.

Ar. welding for women, quota 15, 150-250 hours required, must be able to stand heavy work, 18-

50 years old, \$1.20 per hour.

Aviation sheet metal, for men and women, quota 40, 180-360 hours required, must have manual dexterity and be able to pass physical examination, knowledge of high school algebra and geometry preferred, 18 to 35 years of age, 55-75¢ per hour.

Machinist, men only, quota 150, 360 hours required, mechanical experience preferred, 18-65 years of age, \$1.12 per hour.
