RE-HEARING ASKED IN UNION CONTROL

SALEM, Aug. 10 (AP)—Sponsors of Oregon's Union Control law, passed by the voters four years ago but later declared unconstitutional, asked the state supreme court today to reconsider the decision in which it ordered the sponsors to file expense statements in connection with their campaign to obtain passage of the law.

PROCLAMATION WHEREAS, the unregulated use of certain forest areas is, in my judgment, a menace to life and property on account of the extreme fire hazard caused by an excessive amount of inflammable debris on the ground, and WHEREAS, upon the showing of the State Forester, it appears to me to be necessary to close the unregulated use of the following area in Klamath and Lake counties designated as: AREA NO. 129-P-1—LONG-BELL AREA NO. 1: Township 31 South, Range 11 East; S1 Section 3; Sections 4 and 8; E1 Section 6; E1NE1 Section 7; N1, NE1SW1, and SE1 Section 8; Sections 9 to 16, inclusive; E1 Section 17; NE1 and E1SE1 Section 20; Sections 21 to 28, inclusive; E1E1 Section 29; E1E1 Section 32; Sections 33 to 36, inclusive. Township 31 South, Range 13 East; Sections 7 to 36, inclusive. Township 31 South, Range 18 East; Sections 5 to 8, inclusive; Sections 17 to 20, inclusive; Sections 29 to 32, inclusive. Township 32 South, Range 11 East; Sections 1 to 4, inclusive; E1 Section 5; E1E1 Section 8; Sections 9 to 16, inclusive; E1 Section 17; E1E1 Section 20; Sections 21 to 28, inclusive; Sections 33 to 36, inclusive. Township 32 South, Range 13 East; All of Township, Township 32 South, Range 13 East; Sections 5 to 8, inclusive; Sections 17 to 20, inclusive. With the exception of the road leading to the Lamm Camp in SE corner of Section 21, Township 31 South, Range 11 East. Mr. Chas. W. King, The Long-Bell Lumber company, Yamsey, Oregon. NOW, THEREFORE, I, CHARLES A. SPRAGUE, Governor of the State of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of Section 107-209, Oregon Compiled Laws Annotated, as amended by Chapter 238, Oregon Laws 1941, do hereby proclaim the unregulated use of the above designated area to be unlawful and that said area shall be subject to entry only through permit to be issued by the State Forester, or a fire warden, under which permit entrant shall comply with any and all of the following requirements: (a) To build no fires except in places designated as safe in said permit. (b) To have as a part of his or her equipment tools suitable for extinguishing fire. (c) To refrain from smoking except in places designated as safe in said permit. This proclamation shall be effective from and after the 31st day of July, 1942, and shall remain in full force and effect until the 31st day of December, 1942.
