

RUECK TELLS 1942 GRAIN LOAN RATES

No eligible county producer need accept a price of less than 85 per cent of parity for his barley, wheat or rye this year, regardless of the market price, reminds Fred Rueck, chairman of the county AAA committee, in announcing 1942 loan rates on these crops in this county.

Rueck believes that the barley loan is especially important this year. Because of the unusually large crop in prospect, current market quotations are relatively low, and contracts to purchase the coming crop are being offered growers at prices considerably below the 1942 loan value.

Barley of any class grading No. 5 or better is eligible for loan. The loan rate for No. 1 is 60c per bushel; 58c for No. 2; 57c for No. 3; 54c for No. 4, and 50c for No. 5 grade. These rates apply to barley stored either on the farm or in an eligible commodity credit warehouse, and any producer in compliance with the 1942 AAA program is eligible for a loan.

Same Rate

The loan value for rye grading No. 2 or better is also 60c a bushel, stored either on the farm or in an approved warehouse. Producer eligibility is the same as for barley.

Wheat loan rates for 1942 are between 15 and 16 cents a bushel higher than last year. The loan rates for station points in Klamath county on No. 1 soft white are as follows:

Chiloquin, 1.039 cents per bu.; Dairy, 1.024 cents; Klamath Falls, 1.06 cents; Malin, 1.06 cents; Merrill, 1.06 cents; Modoc Point, 1.033 cents; Pine Ridge, 1.039 cents.

The basic loan value quoted for No. 1 grade wheat is reduced one cent for No. 2 grade; three cents for No. 3; six cents for No. 4, and 6c for No. 5. The loan rate for corresponding grades of hard wheat are one cent higher than for soft wheat.

The maturity date on wheat loans may be extended to April 30, 1944, although the original loan is due April 30, 1943.

An additional storage allowance of seven cents per bushel will be allowed on farm storage loans if the wheat is turned over to commodity credit at the date of the maturity of the loan on April 30, 1943. An additional allowance of five cents per bushel will be allowed for the second year's storage if the loan is extended the second year and then released to commodity credit at the date of maturity. This storage allowance is not made on barley and rye loans.

All grains must have been in storage at least 30 days prior to making the loan. The grain may be stored in bulk or sacks. Any good farm storage in which the quantity of grain under loan may be sealed will qualify.

Commodity credit loans will be made through the local AAA office and detailed information is available to anyone interested. All loans bear interest at the rate of 3 per cent per annum.

SLOT MACHINES PAY FEDERAL TAX

WASHINGTON, Aug. 17 (AP)—Although pin-ball games and slot machines are illegal in a large part of the United States, the treasury disclosed last week that more than 238,000 are in operation and paying federal taxes.

The count was made in totaling returns from new taxes imposed by congress last fall on pin-ball and other "coin-operated amusement devices" at the rate of \$10 a year and on slot machines and other "coin-operated gaming devices" at the rate of \$50 a year. As of June 30, the tax had been paid on 160,894 machines in the pin-ball class and 77,129 in the slot machine group.

The treasury is not required to know the local laws involved in operating these machines. The officials, however, have been getting numerous requests from religious and reform organizations for lists of persons paying the taxes in allegedly forbidden territories.

Woman Is Owner of Circus Slated for This Weekend

EXPERT STUDIES FUEL SHORTAGE

SEATTLE, Aug. 17 (AP)—Brig. Gen. Brice Disque, who as a colonel in the last war directed the army's logging of airplane spruce in Washington and Oregon, studied another wood problem in the Pacific northwest today—the shortage of winter fuel.

"If I were living in this country," he said, "I wouldn't freeze next winter. I'd go out and get my own wood."

"The northwest's fuel problem won't be settled in Washington, D. C. The people here have to settle it. But the shortage of wood, and coal and oil, too, for that matter, can and will be averted," he said.

Estimates show Washington and Oregon will have to have a million tons more coal, however, than local mines can produce. Getting it here will be a problem. And if oil deliveries are shut off, another 816,000 tons of coal will be needed in Seattle alone.

When he completes a survey of the fuel shortage in the two states, Gen. Disque will name a coordinator to work out priorities.

STOCKS RIDE TO RECOVERY WITH RAILS

NEW YORK, Aug. 17 (AP)—Selected stocks took another recovery ride with the rails in today's market and, while scattered leaders failed to get aboard, the excursion generally was termed successful. Transfers approximated 300,000 shares.

Among stocks Santa Fe made a new high since 1938 and top marks for the present year were recorded for Atlantic coast line, Erie certificates, Lehigh Valley Coal Preferred, National Dairy, United Airlines, Pan-American Airways, Hiram Walker, Borden, U. S. Rubber common and preferred and Willys-Overland preferred.

In front most of the time were American Telephone, Anaconda, Sears Roebuck, Westinghouse, Dow Chemical, Eastman Kodak, Chesapeake & Ohio and Union Pacific.

Steels, utilities and motors were narrow. Backward were Homestake Mining, Douglas Aircraft, Chrysler and Western Union.

Bonds generally improved with carriers in demand.

PORTLAND, Aug. 17 (AP)—Ben E. Titus, long-time Portland newspaperman and former assistant publicity director for the state highway department, has been named manager for Oregon of the office of war information.

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STATE TRAFFIC DEATHS DROP 20 PER CENT

Oregon's traffic death rate for the first six months of 1942 dropped 20 per cent below the rate for the corresponding period of 1941, Earl Snell, secretary of state, disclosed today.

Traffic accidents claimed a toll of 119 persons during the first half of this year, compared to 157 last year.

The death rate this year was 8.1 persons killed per one hundred million miles of travel, compared to 10.1 last year.

Close observation of traffic regulations, particularly with reference to speed, will enable the state to maintain this record of traffic improvement, Snell declared. Drivers were urged to stay below the minimum speed limit of 40 miles an hour and to avoid such dangerous practices as passing on curves and while approaching the brow of a hill.

Stop signs have been authorized at main line grade crossings in the state and when they are in place, drivers must bring their cars to a complete stop before proceeding across the tracks. This precaution is believed necessary due to the increased number of trains moving at higher rates of speed due to war transportation demands, it was said.
