

SCHROEDER IS TRANSFERRED TO REDMOND

Captain O. E. Schroeder, for the past year in charge of construction at the Klamath municipal airport for the army engineers, has been transferred to Redmond.

The move indicates nearing completion of the work at the Klamath field, where the civil aeronautics authority has spent approximately \$1,000,000 in constructing three paved runways, lights, a beacon tower and other improvements.

Final touches are now being placed on the third runway. Grant Meyer, out of the Portland office of the army engineers, has taken charge following Captain Schroeder's move to Redmond.

Schroeder came here first as a civilian engineer with the army engineers, but was commissioned when the United States entered the war. He was also in charge of work at Medford and Lakeview while stationed here.

Bonneville Power Deliveries Soar

PORTLAND, Aug. 19 (AP)—Overloading of Bonneville and Grand Coulee generators has lifted Bonneville administration power deliveries to a new peak while saving fuel of private utilities, Administrator Paul J. Raver reported last night.

Deliveries soared to a record high of 678,000 kilowatts, 50,000 more than the two dams' rated capacity of 628,000 kilowatts, Monday. Bonneville's six units produced 312,000 and Coulee's three larger generators in the partially completed west pumphouse turned out 366,000, Raver said.

Dutch Seamen Tie Up Shipping on East, West Coasts

NEW YORK, Aug. 19 (AP)—Dutch seamen and officers seeking improved working conditions and post-war social security have tied up Netherlands shipping on both the east and west coasts after four months of fruitless negotiations with their government.

The action was disclosed yesterday when the International Transport Workers Federation notified The Netherlands ministry on industry, commerce and shipping at its New York office that 500 Dutch mariners had voted Monday night to refuse to take their ships to sea until an agreement was reached. Union spokesmen said the move should not be considered a strike, asserting that the affected vessels—the number of which was not announced—would be loaded, worked and serviced as heretofore and that nothing would be done to interfere with shifting them within American harbors.

GRAIN FIRES

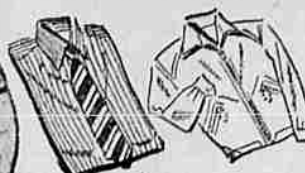
