

## MID-WEST GASOLINE DELIVERIES HALTED

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21 (AP)—Petroleum Coordinator Harold Ikes today prohibited railroad delivery of automobile gasoline in 20 states in the middle west and southwest in a move to release an estimated 5000 to 7000 tank cars for supplying the east.

The states brought under the ban were Texas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Oklahoma, Arkansas, Tennessee, Kentucky, Missouri, Kansas, Nebraska, Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, Ohio, Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota, North Dakota and South Dakota.

Deputy Coordinator Ralph K. Davies said it "remains to be seen" whether rationing of petroleum would be made necessary in those states as a result of the order.

He added that the diversion of additional tank cars would not aid the east's gasoline rationed motorists since the railroad cars would be used almost exclusively to build up fuel oil stocks in the east, particularly in New England, against the coming of winter.

SEATTLE, Aug. 21 (AP)—Increased demands of the armed forces in the Pacific and possible government commandeering of tankers may force rationing of gasoline and fuel oils this winter in the Pacific northwest, Clarence S. Bessemeyer, chairman of the marketing committee for the fifth district under the petroleum coordinator, has warned.

Bessemeyer last night advised "every industry, school, public building and home in the state using fuel oil" to fill their tanks immediately.

## DEPENDENTS' PAY BILL GETS OK

WASHINGTON, Aug. 21 (AP)—President Roosevelt today signed a bill permitting living allowances due the dependents of service men to be paid as soon as necessary bookkeeping can be completed.

The bill amends the original allotment act which barred any payments until after November 1.

Chairman Reynolds (D-N.C.) of the senate military affairs committee has expressed doubt whether the legislation actually would speed payments of sums accumulated since the law went into effect June 1, quoting war department officials as saying it would be impossible to make computations and write checks before November 1.

However, navy department spokesmen indicated they could make payments immediately.

## Chinese Recapture Kiangsi Stronghold

CHUNGKING, Aug. 21 (AP)—An official Chinese military report today said Chinese forces had recaptured Kwangfeng, which the Japanese had developed into one of their most powerful strongholds in Kiangsi province.

It was stated the recapture had dispelled the threat of the first overland Japanese invasion of Fukien province.

The Chinese were said to have retaken the city yesterday morning after by-passing it in the Kiangsi campaign in which they have recaptured Kweiki, Shang-jao and other points to wrest from the Japanese the control of a 60-mile stretch of the eastern Kiangsi railroad.
