

MRS. WALKER PASSES AWAY TUESDAY NIGHT

Mrs. Sarah Adeline Walker, 84, for 62 years a resident of Klamath county and one of its best-loved pioneers, passed away at 10:25 p. m. Tuesday. Death came at her home at Pine and Fifth streets, where she had lived 40 years.

Funeral services will be held at Whitlock's at 3 p. m. Friday, and burial will be at the Ashland cemetery at 1:30 p. m. Saturday.

When the Klamath country was raw, remote and undeveloped, "Addie" Walker, then Addie Witt, came to visit her two sisters at the tiny settlement at Sprague River. That was in 1879.

There she met and married William Albert Walker, and they established their home at Bly when there was hardly a wagon road in that country. The old Walker home, 14 miles west of Bly on the Lakeview highway, is one of the landmarks of that country still.

Mrs. Walker, alert and vivacious despite her advanced years, often entertained her friends with tales of the early days at Bly. She told of the months of deep snows, of the trips to community parties when the wagon wheels sank to the hub in the mud, of the hardships and the good times that made up life in the back country in the 'eighties and 'nineties.

Her husband was one of the Klamath country's best known ranchers. He rode the ranges of the Bly region, became owner of four fine ranches, and in some years stacked 2500 tons of hay. He was one of the organizers of the First National bank of Klamath Falls and was active in community affairs. He died June 1, 1910.

Mrs. Walker was born at Roseburg in 1858. She attended Wilbur academy near Roseburg and the Applegate school. She was a member of the Rebekah lodge from 1902, and was a past noble grand of that organization. During the World War she had charge of Red Cross work in Klamath county. She served on the Bly school board for years. Survivors include two sons, Earl E., of Klamath Falls, and Luke E., of Portland.

"Conshy" Deserter Turned Over to Juvenile Officers

PORTLAND, Aug. 26 (AP)—Federal Judge Leon R. Yankwich left no doubt as to what he thought about violations of laws governing conscientious objectors.

Before he turned over the case of Kenneth Farson to juvenile authorities yesterday, he said from the bench:

"So liberal is the law that no matter what sort of conscience you have, there is no excuse for not complying with the law."

Deputy U. S. attorneys told the court that Farson ran away from the objectors' camp at Cascade Locks after eight days because he disliked washing dishes and chopping wood. Farson went to Seattle and found a job at the Boeing plant where he stayed for eight months before he was discovered.

"Just because you don't like the kind of work to which you are assigned is no excuse to run away," Judge Yankwich said. "That is no desertion under the law, but it is tantamount to it."

TWO INJURED IN SUNDAY ACCIDENT

Ted Igl, son of Mr. and Mrs. E. M. Igl, is suffering from a back injury and Larry Parlette, soldier, is in the base hospital at Camp White with a sprained back as the result of an accident in which the Igl car rolled down an embankment on the Dead Indian road, it was learned here. The incident occurred about 16 miles out of Ashland at 9 o'clock Sunday night.

Parlette had been spending the day at Lake o' the Woods with a large group of soldiers from Camp White and was left behind when the trucks pulled out. The Igl's offered their car to enable him to rejoin the other soldiers. Igl and Glenn Lorenz, son of Mr. and Mrs. G. C. Lorenz, and Parlette, with the soldier driving, started out in an attempt to catch up with the trucks.

The driver was blinded by the stifling dust, the car skidded on loose gravel on making a turn and the convertible cabriolet left the road and plunged fifty feet down an embankment, it was reported. They were said to be going at a moderate speed.

The top of the convertible was down and all three occupants were thrown clear. Lorenz escaped injury except for shock. The car was said to be totally wrecked.

Confessed Nazi Spy Pleads Innocent In Federal Court

NEW YORK, Aug. 26 (AP)—Otto Willmet, Chicago leader of the German-American Bund and confessed Nazi spy, pleaded

innocent today to federal court indictments charging conspiracy to counsel Bund members not to serve in U. S. armed forces, and a plot to make false statements in violation of the alien registration law.

He was held in \$10,000 bail

for trial with 25 other Bund leaders on September 8.

Willmet, 37, was sentenced in Hartford, Conn., federal court last week to five years imprisonment after he and three others pleaded guilty to charges they conspired to deliver military secrets to the axis.
