POTATO GROWERS
MEETING SLATED

A meeting of Klamath county potato growers will be held at the Henley grange hall Tuesday, September 8, at 3 p. m. This meeting is for the purpose of reorganizing the Potato Growers' association and to take up matters of importance to potato growers of the county.

L. C. Stoll, chief of the U. S. employment service for Oregon, is expected to be present to discuss the labor supply. Stoll's department has been asked by potato growers to furnish a list of agricultural help that will come to Klamath county from other districts at the start of potato harvest the latter part of September.

The Henley grange hall is located in the old Mt. Laki school, just back of Mac's Cash store, 11 miles south of Klamath Falls on the Merrill highway.

May Opposes Draft
Of Married Men
For Year and Half

WASHINGTON, Sept. 3 (AP)—Representative May (D-Ky.) chairman of the house military committee, expressed belief today that married men with dependent wives and children should not be called into service for another year and one half.

He said that he based his opinion on a selective service survey of manpower requirements and figures obtained during a recent conference with Selective Service Director Hershey. Simultaneously, he said that the war department probably would ask congress by January 1 to lower the minimum limit for selective service from 20 to 18 years.

He maintained that married men with children should be called up for service only after "all other" sources of manpower have been exhausted.
