REALTORS COMMEND TAX COORDINATION

The movement initiated by the Klamath county court for coordination between the various tax levying bodies of the county was commended by the Klamath Realty board at its regular weekly meeting at the Willard hotel.

The motion approved the action of the members of the levying units for originating the idea of an organization to study tax problems collectively, and coordination of endeavor to enable necessary progress without duplication or waste.

W. O. Smith, member of the city budget committee for many years, was the guest speaker of the day, and was introduced as the pioneer authority on tax matters. Smith outlined the program formulated by the tax committee of the chamber of commerce, of which he is the chairman, and reported upon the conference of tax levying officials held at the courthouse last Saturday. The action by the board followed this comprehensive report upon the conference.

State May Lease Beach Sand to Chrome Company

SALEM, Sept. 10 (P)—Governor Charles A. Sprague disclosed today that the state land board is considering a proposal to lease 120 acres of beach sand, which might pave the way for a vast project whereby Oregon would furnish 20 per cent of the nation's chrome needs.

The Oregon Chrome company wants to lease the tidal beach sands in Coos county, paying the land board 74 per cent of its gross sales. The money would go into the school fund.

Drafting of Steel Workers Predicted

YOUNGSTOWN, O., Sept. 10 (P)—Youngstown's steel mills will draft workers within two months because of a labor shortage, a U. S. employment service official predicts.

Herbert R. Weiler, manager of the employment service office here, reported the occupational questionnaires of selective service registrants were being used to recruit war plant workers.

About 500 cards are being sent out daily to deferred registrants asking them to report to the employment office and take war jobs if they already are not engaged in essential work, he added.

Now the Women Patch Pavements

SALEM, Sept. 10 (P)—Six women truck drivers, working as a pavement patching crew, now are employed by the state highway commission, State Highway Engineer R. H. Baldock said today.

Nine other women are working as flaggers and rock checkers.
