U OF O OFFERS TYPING COURSE

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Sept. 15—Appointment of Miss Jessie M. Smith, assistant secretary of the state board of higher education, to full time instructor in typing and shorthand is announced by Dr. Victor P. Morris, dean of the school of business administration, as part of the school's effort to meet increased demands for trained stenographers. Miss Smith's appointment was approved at its September meeting by the state board of higher education.
