

ALIENS WARNED AFTER ROUNDUP IN CALIFORNIA

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 17 (AP)—The FBI served notice today on enemy aliens, after a roundup of suspected war regulation violators extending through 23 northern California counties, that there would be no relaxation in the curfew and travel restrictions.

H. C. Van Pelt, special FBI agent in charge, reported that the action had extended last night into 78 cities and towns, with 350 special agents, police and state highway patrolmen participating.

Red Tape

Germans and Italians, he said, were found who had been evading or ignoring the proclamation issued by Lieutenant General John L. DeWitt, western defense commander, last March 24 fixing an 8 p. m. curfew for all enemy aliens and restricting their movements to not more than five miles from their place of residence.

Van Pelt said an Italian at Monterey asserted he "didn't have time" to obtain permits, as permitted under the proclamation, when he moved four times. A San Mateo Italian, he added, thought there would be "too much red tape" in obtaining a permit to keep his meat market open after 8 p. m.

Weapons Taken

Those arrested were booked at the nearest county jail as "en route to the United States marshal," to be removed for hearing before the enemy alien board.

Van Pelt also disclosed that from December 7, 1941, to September 15, 1942, a total of 1204 enemy aliens had been arrested in northern California—604 Japanese, 344 Italians and 256 Germans—for violations of curfew, travel, contraband and other regulations. Contraband seized included 225 firearms, 87,414 rounds of ammunition, 433 swords, bayonets, daggers and stilettoes, 12 sticks of dynamite, 881 signaling devices, 222 cameras and 104 short wave radio receivers.

British Vessel Sunk in Caribbean

WASHINGTON, Sept. 17 (AP)—The navy announced today that a medium-sized British merchant vessel was torpedoed and sunk by an enemy submarine in the Caribbean area during the latter part of August. Survivors have landed at an east coast port.

Army Private Shot After Slaying "His Best Friend"

PORTLAND, Ore., Sept. 17 (AP)—An hour after he fatally wounded his divorced wife's husband, Richard Cox, Portland, 24-year-old army private from Sheppard Field, Tex., turned his gun on himself. He was surrounded by officers in Mount Scott park here last midnight.

Detective H. C. Sammons said Jack Spaats, 28, was shot by Cox as he stepped from his house in southeast Portland on his way to his shipyard job. He died en route to a hospital.

It was first believed that a shot fired by Deputy Sheriff H. S. Hargreaves ended Cox's life, but an examination at the morgue proved the fatal wound to have been self-inflicted.

Police and sheriff's deputies closed in on Cox after two boys said a soldier had told them: "I've just killed my best friend. He had it coming. Tell the cops to come and get me. They'll never take me alive."

Mrs. Spaats told police that

Cox had threatened her husband some months earlier when they lived at Bend and was arrested, but released on his promise not to repeat the offense.

Detective Sammons said local authorities did not know whether Cox was here from Sheppard Field on furlough, was AWOL or en route to another post.

FUEL OIL RATION IN MIDDLE WEST

WASHINGTON, Sept. 17 (AP)—Fuel oil rationing—possibly 25 per cent below normal use—has been ordered in a vast 30-state area for the coming heating season.

In addition to the 17 Atlantic seaboard states in which gasoline already is rationed, supplies of fuel oil will be curtailed in these 13 middle western states: Minnesota, Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, Missouri, Iowa, Kansas, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota and Kentucky.

In an order last night authorizing fuel oil rationing, Chairman Donald M. Nelson of the war production board said the shortage of oil "remains serious," despite shifts in transportation and conversions to coal.

"The fuel oil shortage, resulting as it does from a loss of (tanker) transportation, is a war burden that should be spread over the country as far as practicable," Nelson asserted. "The middle western states, although presently approximately in balance, are the nearest points from which fuel oil may be drawn, with a minimum of transportation facilities, to mitigate somewhat the eastern shortage. This withdrawal of fuel oils from the middle west necessitates rationing in that area."

Willkie Arrives In Russia Today

KUIBYSHV, Russia, Sept. 17 (AP)—Wendell Willkie arrived by air today at this branch capital of the U. S. S. R.

He came from Teheran, Iran, on an air-tour as President Roosevelt's volunteer messenger of American home unity which has taken him through the middle east and which will include China.

Tours to inspect a new hydroelectric plant on the Volga and the new sites of war industries moved back from Russia's western war zone have been organized for him.

He will be guest at a special concert arranged in his honor.

Police Turn In Speeders' Names

SALEM, Sept. 17 (AP)—State police since last May have given the state tire rationing admini-

trator the names of 484 motorists who have been arrested for speeding. State Police Supt. Charles P. Pray said today.

These persons will be ineligible to buy new tires, as will the trucking operators arrested for overloading their vehicles. The guilty truckers' names are given to the tire rationing administrator by the state police and state highway commission.
