KLAMATH SCHOOL KIDS GET 'SHOT'

Klamath county school kids were getting "shot" this week by Dr. Peter H. Rozendal, Klamath county health officer, who hoped to complete the immunization program by the latter part of the month.

Dr. Rozendal makes his second trip to Chilcoquin, Algoma and Fort Klamath on Wednesday to give the last of the diphtheria immunizations and the first shot of smallpox.

The program, to include all schools in the county, was started three weeks ago. City schools will follow the county. Wednesday of next week Dr. Rozendal will go to the northernmost part of the county including Shevlin, Gilchrist and La Pine, the latter school in Deschutes county but due to the illness of Dr. Thome, Bend, the local health officer will assist at that point.

Dr. Rozendal said he would also give physical examinations to children referred to him by teachers and nurses.

"Witness" Lawyers Seek Test of Portland Ruling

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 7 (AP)—Attorneys for the Jehovah's Witness sect today began an attempt to clear the way for a federal supreme court test of the validity of a Portland ordinance.

They asked the state supreme court to suspend its mandate in the case of Portland against Ada McSparran. They want the records in such shape they can ask the federal court for a writ of certiorari by which constitutionality of the ordinance may be determined.

Mrs. McSparran was fined \$21 in municipal court for permitting children to sell or distribute papers (the Jehovah's Witness tract) on the streets in violation of an ordinance. She appealed to the circuit court which sustained the fine but suspended payment. From this the appeal was taken to the state supreme court which held it had no jurisdiction because there is no appeal from a circuit court in cases involving city ordinances, the circuit court being final in such instances.

STATE SHIFTS TRAINING PLAN TO FARM LABOR

PORTLAND, Oct. 7 (AP)—Oregon will shift the emphasis in its labor training program from industrial workers to farm labor at once.

The production of food, threatened by a labor shortage, is the most important thing right now, the state advisory committee on war production training said yesterday.

Four thousand persons will be trained for farm work in a \$130,000 program already started in some sections of the state.

The decision was taken after Harley Libby, Jefferson, vice president of the Oregon Farmers' union, said food production was falling off as farmers and their hired men were being drafted.

Some farm youths, he said, are going into higher paying industrial jobs and others are reluctant to ask draft deferment because they do not realize the importance of their work.

The committee also proposed a campaign to persuade workers to stay on the farm.
