

NAZIS CLAIM NEXT-TO-LAST NEST STORMED

defenders checked the nazi onslaught after retiring from a north-west industrial settlement which had been the scene of one of the greatest battles of the campaign.

West Bank Won
Latest reports said the Germans were now hurling at least four infantry divisions (60,000 troops) and a tank division into the main assault, with the Russians battling fiercely to prevent the invaders from fanning out along the banks of the Volga and breaking the flanks of the defense.

Berlin broadcasts said the Germans had already won the west bank of the Volga along a two-mile front and had occupied half of Stalingrad.

It was the fourth day of the revitalized nazi offensive to batter the city into surrender before winter closes down.

High-lighting the ferocity of the German assault, soviet headquarters reported that nazi infantry led by 40 tanks stormed a single street inside the city, only to encounter a murderous defense fire which destroyed 23 of the tanks and killed 350 enemy troops.

soldiers are guaranteed at least a year of training before being sent into combat.

This proposal, General Marshall said in a letter read to the house by Representative Wadsworth (R-N. Y.), author of the bill, would seriously handicap the war department. Marshall pleaded for congress to "trust our judgment."

As passed by the house, the bill provided that any teen-age boy called for induction may obtain a deferment until the end of the present school year, but not later than next July 1, if he is attending high school, college or university.

It also provided that before married men are drafted, there be no available single men in their state, the effect being to put draft board quotas on a state rather than a local basis.

The vote which defeated the move to guarantee a year's training was on accepting a rules committee recommendation that preventing consideration of any amendments except those bearing directly on changing the present age limits.

The crest reached Washington at 7:20 a. m., when the Potomac river measured 17.56 feet above mean low water level at Gauge in the Georgetown area.

Railroad traffic south from Washington also was restored early this morning, relieving among other things, the congestion at the huge station here, where thousands had spent the night.

quarters forecast a giant battle between the United States and Japanese fleets in the Solomon Island coincident with the bitter struggle for control of Guadalcanal air base, and Secretary of the Navy Knox declared:

"There is no concealing there's a good, stiff, tough fight on."

In the absence of specific details, Knox's comment at a press conference late yesterday reflected a restrained optimism and indicated at least that the battle was far from one-sided despite the fact that the Japanese were bringing their heaviest forces to bear.

While the navy carefully guarded its fleet movements, Washington naval sources saw the likelihood of a sea engagement possibly even greater than the battle at Midway or in the Coral sea.

GEN. MACARTHUR'S HEAD-QUARTERS, Australia, Oct. 17 (AP)—Allied mountain troops forced the Japanese to withdraw a short distance in the Owen Stanle; mountains of New Guinea yesterday and fighting is continuing and increasing in scope, allied headquarters announced today.

STOLEN CAR FOUND NEAR LOWER LAKE

What is left of a 1934 Ford sedan bearing Oregon license No. 374-944 and registered to Wilbur Wakeman, California avenue, was found by state police in the brush near the lower Klamath lake road. The car was devoid of wheels, tires, the carburetor and other parts. Alfred Huston, arrested by city police on a larceny from a dwelling charge, was questioned by state officers and he told of accompanying Kenneth Van Winkle to the point where the machine was abandoned. Officers said Van Winkle took the car on Sunday, October 4, drove it to within one quarter of a mile of a lower Klamath lake ranch where he was working, and the next day had Huston take his car and bring him back to the ranch after he had abandoned the machine in the brush. Huston denied that either he or Van Winkle stripped the car. Huston was transferred from the city to the county jail and will be given a hearing Monday.
