PRE-INDUCTION PLAN SHIFTS KUHS CLASSES

PORTLAND, Oct. 30 (P)—The state game commission's bulletin today recommended Rogue river to Oregon fishermen this weekend:

The commission's brief county-by-county report: Coos—Fair fishing in the southern half of the county, no catches reported from northern streams. Some fair catches of salmon and trout reported from Coquille river. Coos bay and Isthmus inlet fair for bass. Catfish limits reported from Ten Mile lake. Jackson—Rogue yielding good steelhead catches on eggs with best fishing reported at Hardy Rapids. Limit trout catches reported with single eggs in Rogue and good catches of trout from Applegate river, also with eggs. Josephine—Daily limit bags of steelhead and trout being taken from Grants Pass section of Rogue with Robertson bridge-Grave creek bridge section best.
