Pierce, today undertook an investigation of conditions at the Japanese War Reloca-tion Center, Tulelake, California. A personal represent-ative of the Tolan Committee is en route to Klamath Falls and Tulelake with instructions to investigate and make a confidential report to that committee. Dillon Myer, Di-rector of the War Relocation Authority, has promised to go the limit in finding and uprooting the cause of dissatis-faction at Tulelake as it affects that section and the neighboring industrial and agricultural communities in

Klamath county. Complaints ha by prominent Klamath citizens, among them, Mr. Fred H. Heilbronner, and Governor Sprague of Oregon had found it necessary to give his attention to unsatisfactory conditions prevailing there. These conditions were reported to Representative Walter M. Pierce when he visited Klamath county, October 18, 19 and 20th. Prominent citizens of Klamath Falls, Merrill, and Malin also reported unsatisfactory conditions and Mr. Pierce immediately made a trip to this Japanese Cen-
