

CONTEST FOR SPEAKER OF HOUSE OPENS

PORTLAND, Nov. 5 (AP)—The contest for speaker of the state house of representatives is underway already.

Harvey Wells, veteran Multnomah representative, said Multnomah and Clackamas representatives would meet here Thursday night to consider candidates.

He said three of them would speak. They are William M. McAllister, Jackson county; Herman M. Chindgren, Clackamas county; John Steelhammer, Marion county.

ASTORIA, Nov. 5 (AP)—The republican election sweep was complete in Clatsop county. Fred Heilberg, Astoria democrat, defeated Democrat Frank Wooden, Nehalem valley farmer, 3603 to 2404, for state representative.

Dr. Orval M. Eaton was named

mayor of Astoria, and Jake Pletterla defeated Axel Williams, incumbent democrat, for city commissioner. Other candidates were unopposed.

BAKER, Nov. 5 (AP)—A proposed city manager form of government for Baker was turned down at the polls, election returns showed today, 1333 to 84.

THE DALLES, Nov. 5 (AP)—The Dalles residents authorized the city to raise \$125,000 by bond issue in two charter amendments, election returns showed today.

One of \$100,000 for purchase of industrial sites was approved, 561 to 241. The other, \$25,000 for operation of The Dalles airport across the Columbia river in Washington, passed, 540 to 264.

LA GRANDE, Nov. 5 (AP)—The second attempt apparently was successful for proponents of a \$925,000 bond issue for the Union county people's utility district.

Complete unofficial election returns gave the proposal an 87-vote margin, 2286 to 2199. The measure was defeated by 26 votes in the primary election.

"Missing" Flier Returns In Plane Found on Beach

SOMEWHERE IN NEW GUINEA, Nov. 5 (AP)—A young California flier who bailed out of his fighter plane over the New Guinea jungle yesterday returned to base today in a plane he found abandoned on a beach. With him was a young native boy who served as a seat cushion.

Field attendants stared unbelievably as Pilot Lieutenant James Miller, of Salinas, Calif., previously listed as missing, climbed from the plane and then lifted out the young boong (native).

It happened like this: While on a fighter mission over the jungle Miller encountered severe weather and bailed out. He landed without mishap and was picked up by some na-

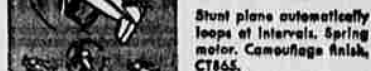

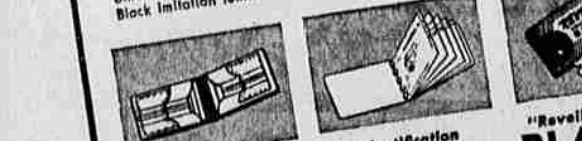
