

APPEAL MADE IN WEST COAST MEAT SHORTAGE

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 18 (AP)—The Pacific coast's meat shortage was brought urgently to the attention of the federal government today by restaurants feeding 30,000 defense workers in a shipyard boom town. The town is Richmond, San Francisco bay site of four of Henry J. Kaiser's record-breaking shipyards.

Might As Well Close
Mrs. Mattie Chandler, mayor of Richmond, asking the government to boost OPA meat quotas and take other actions to supply meat, said:

"The restaurants say if they can't get meat, they might as well close, because these war workers are big meat eaters."

Population Boom
Mayor Chandler said that nine butcher shops in Richmond already had closed because of lack of supplies.

She declared that OPA quotas provided normal meat supplies for 15,000 persons when actually Richmond has a population of 100,000, a 75,000 increase in a year because of war industry activities.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 18 (AP) Slaughterhouse workers agreed unanimously Tuesday to go back to work when an emergency committee assured them their wage arbitration would be speeded up.

Milton Maxwell, international vice president of the Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butcher Workmen, said work would be resumed at 10 closed packing plants Wednesday morning.

Lack of meat had closed virtually every meat market in San Francisco and most of the bay area communities. Maxwell said it would be Thursday at the earliest before pork and lamb could be supplied to the shops, and Friday before beef deliveries could be made.

FIRE ALARMS FOR OCTOBER TOTAL 16

October was a nice, almost record breaking balmy month, but city firemen were called out on 16 alarms, one of which was false, according to Fire Chief Keith K. Ambrose in his report to the city council Monday night. Total fire loss was given at \$1246.50, with \$1021.50 insurance collected.

Fires classified by occupancy included: public buildings, 1; dwellings, 8; lumber industry, 1; restaurants, 2; miscellaneous, 3; motor vehicles, 1; total, 16. Careless smokers led the list of causes, Fire Chief Ambrose stated. Hot ashes resulted in one fire, matches or careless smokers, 8; conflagration, 1; friction, 1; hot grease, 1; open lights, 1; petroleum and its products, 1; overheated or defective flues, 1; overheated stoves, 1; total, 16.

Drastic Cut Made In Production of Kitchen Utensils

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18 (AP) The War Production board Tuesday prohibited, effective November 23, production of thousands of kitchen tools and utensils made of iron or steel.

Taking the final step in a series of orders designed to conserve metals going into kitchen gadgets, the order eliminated—as far as iron and steel is used—such common items as bottle openers and cork screws.

In hundreds of other instances, WPB permitted continued production on condition that metal use is cut drastically.
