BUYING TIDE EBBS IN DAY'S SHORT SESSION

NEW YORK, Nov. 21 (AP)—The buying tide ebbed in parts of today's stock market as profits were cashed on Friday's bulge and commitments lightened for weekend protection but gold mines and other post-war favorites retained a degree of popularity.

Dealings, generally, were sluggish although sizable blocks of low-priced issues, the majority of which were about unchanged, helped put the two-hour volume in the neighborhood of 300,000 shares. Closing prices were a trifle spotty and narrow. Under water at intervals were Santa Fe, Northern Pacific, American Telephone, Western Union and United Aircraft.

Bonds were a shade uneven. Commodities did better. Closing quotations
