Colorado Suspends Athletics

Space Needed for Wartime Physical Education School

BOULDER, Colo., Dec. 8 (AP) All intercollegiate athletics are suspended for Colorado university this winter because, its president says, facilities and space are needed for a wartime physical education program affecting every male student in school.

The suspension was announced yesterday by President Robert L. Stearns. Whether the ban will extend beyond the winter term, he said, will be decided "each quarter as it arrives."

Colorado's withdrawal from basketball leaves the mountain state athletic conference with only two schools on the eastern end of a two-division competitive schedule drawn up in Salt Lake City last weekend.

Colorado, Wyoming and Colorado State formed the eastern division. The conference schedule called for a playoff in Salt Lake City in February between the eastern leader and the top team on the western circuit, comprising Utah, Utah State and Brigham Young university.

Harry Hughes, athletic director at Colorado State, said in Fort Collins last night that the Aggies and Wyoming probably would go ahead with their four-game schedule—the winner to meet the western champion.

Don Hutson Claims Pro Score Title

CHICAGO, Dec. 8 (AP)—Don Hutson, the Green Bay Packers' pass-grabbing end, was officially acclaimed today as the National Football league's scoring champion for 1942, with records that will probably stand longer than any others in the book.

Hutson caught 17 touchdown passes, place-kicked 33 extra points—both records—and added a field goal for a total 138 points, also a record. His record output last season was 95 points.

The next four places went to the Chicago Bears. Ray McLean posted 54 points for second place, followed by Gary Fagiolli with 48, Frank Maznicki with 45 and Hugh Gallarneau with 42.

Cubs Retain 'Mad Russian' For Batting

CHICAGO, Dec. 8 (AP)—There were some rumors at the recent major league baseball meeting that the Chicago Cubs' Lou Novikoff, the Mad Russian, may be traded.

Cub Manager James Gallagher has squelched the idea. "Why should we trade him now?" asks Gallagher. "Novikoff has made me walk the floor. Maybe we should have bounced him after the first look, but I guess we must have enjoyed the pain he caused."

"Anyway, his batting may come up to expectations and if it does we want him doing it in a Cub
