

FDR'S REQUEST FOR WAR-TIME POWER STALLED

WASHINGTON, Dec. 10 (AP)—The house ways and means committee today formally pigeon-holed President Roosevelt's request for broad wartime authority to suspend tariff laws and regulations.

The action came after several members of the committee conferred with House Speaker Rayburn (D-Tex.).

Chairman Doughton (D-N.C.) reported that the committee had decided that there was "no reasonable possibility" that the bill could be enacted before the 77th session of congress expires on January 3.

Cattlemen Object
Doughton declared that even if the committee had reported the bill, it was unlikely that the house could muster a quorum for its consideration, and that in any event, the legislation would then have to be considered by the senate.

One objection to tariff law suspension came from cattlemen, who expressed fear the administration bill would have been used to bring in Argentine beef.

Brig-Gen. Hurley Has Narrow Escape On Russian Tour

MOSCOW, Dec. 10 (AP)—Brig. Gen. Patrick J. Hurley, who returned two days ago from a long tour of the Russian front, was disclosed today to have come so close to hitting a land mine that his car was showered with parts of two trucks which did.

Hurley, U. S. minister to New Zealand and onetime secretary of war under President Hoover, was being driven along a newly captured road following two trucks. Both trucks hit the mine and blew up within his sight.

MEXICO CITY, Dec. 10 (AP)—Except in cases where the ministry of agriculture issues a special permit, the exportation of lumber from Mexico is banned under a decree issued yesterday.

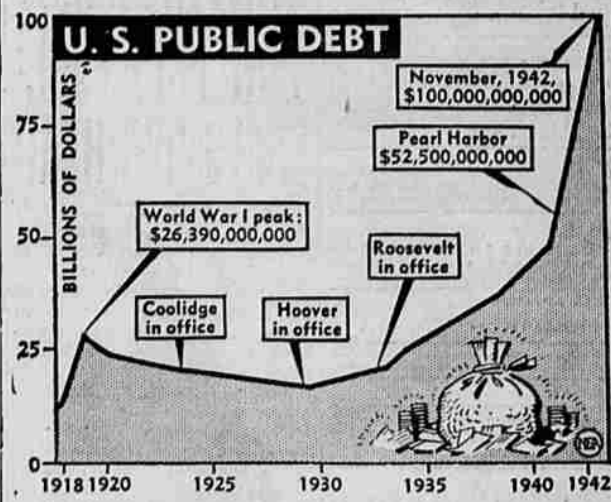
Sisemore said that anyone wishing to contribute to the war fund immediately may do so, and if the contribution is made before the first of the year it may count on income tax deductions for this year.

VIEW ON MEXICAN LABOR CONFLICTS

SAN FRANCISCO, Calif., Dec. 10 (AP)—The 24,000 members of the American Farm bureau were at odds today with the federation's information department chief, George Norris, in Washington, over the Mexican labor importation problem.

Norris yesterday asserted American farmers would "revolt" should the importations not be dropped.

Ray Weiser, California bureau president, said his membership "does not subscribe to the views expressed," and J. J. Deuel, head of the federation law department, estimated California farmers would use 50,000 Mexican laborers in the state next year.
