

TRUCKERS MUST FILE BLANKS BY DECEMBER 15

Truck owners who do not file their applications for certificates of war necessity by December 15, will face cancellation of the applications, Herman O. Sites, district manager of the ODT motor transport division, said today.

"When these truckers were given temporary gasoline rations for December, it was only on their statement that they would complete their applications for the certificates of war necessity. They are not doing it. Sites said. More than 5000 applications which were given out in this office have not been returned and they are now dribbling in at the rate of less than 200 a day. Of these, about half must be returned to the applicant because they are incomplete."

Start Over

There will be no further extension of time for commercial vehicle owners to obtain the certificates which they must have to purchase gasoline, tires or parts after January 1.

Because of the necessity of returning the incomplete forms for further information, Sites said, it will be impossible to accept the applications after December 15 and all those not returned by that date will be cancelled and the truck owner will have to start his application again from scratch with the virtual certainty that he will be without gasoline coupons for a period after January 1.

BROTHERS SPLIT

SOUTH BEND, Ind., Dec. 11 (AP)—The graduation of Dick Creevy and Tom Miller will break up the first combination of two brothers ever to play football for Notre Dame.

Tom and Creighton Miller both won letters. Dick Creevy won his sweater, but his brother, Tom, failed. It's the first time two brothers have won letters the same year. The Millers were preceded by their father, Harry "Red" Miller, 1908 captain, and their uncles Don, Walter, Jerry and Ray—all Irish grid greats.

PASSING MASTER

SOUTH BEND, Ind., Dec. 11 (AP)—Angelo Bertelli, Notre Dame's pass-master, was just as effective this year although not as accurate as in his 1941 sophomore season.

In 1941 he passed 123 times, completed 70, had 10 intercepted and made 1027 yards. This fall he tossed 102, completed 72, had 18 picked off and made 1039 yards.

He lost 12 yards rushing however, being lacked on pass attempts. His 1942-total gain is 1027—matching his sophomore record exactly.

ARMY OFFICER FACES CHARGE OF SEDITION

Chief Clerk

SEATTLE, Dec. 11 (AP)—A Seattle newspaper's agreement with regional military authorities regarding limited use of a story it had uncovered today brought from both the office of censorship and the war department statements that no restrictions of the kind can be required.

The story concerned the arrest of a young army officer at Fort Lewis, Wash., in connection with allegedly seditious activities. The Seattle Post-Intelligencer said that, in obtaining clearance for publication, it had entered into an understanding that the story should not carry more than a one-column headline.

This agreement, relayed by the Associated Press as an advisory note to editors in transmitting the story to its members, brought immediate protest from newspapers in many sections of the country.

Subsequently the office of censorship and the war department at Washington, to which the matter was referred, said the army had no authority or intention of advising papers on how they should handle their news.

The Post-Intelligencer, in its account of the Fort Lewis incident, said there had been reports, linked with the young officer, of attempts to "vilify President Roosevelt" and form a subversive element within the army.

"It is understood," the newspaper said, "that the officer mailed seditious literature to members of the one-time America first committee and to William Dudley Pelley's Silver-shirts. The arrested officer likewise is reported to have attempted to organize a subversive organization within the army itself."

The Post-Intelligencer described the officer as "a young man not long out of college and with a radical political background," and said he faces charges of sedition, "punishable by from 10 to 20 years in an army disciplinary barracks."

Every Individual Must Have Ration Book 1 By Dec. 15, Warns Board

The public was warned by the war price and ration board Friday that it is essential that every individual have war ration book No. 1 before December 15, 1942.

The idea is that a person must have war ration book No. 1 (the coffee and sugar book) in order to get war ration book No. 2. Book 2 will be necessary to obtain many articles of clothing as well as food and other essentials, and therefore, regardless of one's coffee and sugar situation, he must get No. 1 in order to get No. 2.

Application for book No. 1 may be made at the war price and ration board offices near Fifth and Main streets.

The statement from the board follows in part:

"It is essential that every individual have War Ration Book No. 1 before December 15, 1942. This is the 'sugar book,' which is also the 'coffee book.' Every person who has not registered for this book, regardless of whether or not he buys sugar or coffee must do so in order to obtain war ration book No. 2 which will be issued early in 1943. Registrant shall apply on OPA Form R-201. With his application he must submit proof of identity and address. This may be a Selective Service registration card, automobile driver's license, bank book, etc. If this proof of identity also shows the applicant's present address, it may be accepted as proof of both identity and address.

"Proof of present address may be a currently dated utility bill, a post marked envelope, properly addressed to the applicant, etc. Applicant must also present to the board a record of his address on May 4, 1942, and each of his addresses since that date, including his present address, also an affidavit that he has not registered previously, and why no previous application was made, any other evidence the board may think necessary.

"Only persons exempted are those who are out of the country; persons serving in the armed forces; persons confined to hospitals or other institutions. These exemptions must register within a month after return to normal living conditions.

"It is particularly important that unmarried men and women who may be living in camps,

hotels and boarding houses give this matter prompt attention, as War Ration Book No. 2 will be necessary to secure many articles of clothing and other essentials as well as food.

"In order to facilitate this registration, the local War Price and Ration Board offices at 434 Main street will remain open all day on Saturday, December 12. Forms can be mailed to those persons living out of town upon request."
