WHEAT

CHICAGO, Dec. 21 (AP)—Wheat prices tumbled more than a cent a bushel today from the highest quotations since 1937 as profit taking sales halted the slow advance which had added 5 to 12 cents to values since the first of the month.

There was a letup in demand from mills and reports of enlarged country selling of cash wheat in some localities encouraged the selling. Spot wheat, with No. 2 hard quoted at \$1.41, was 9 cents over the government loan rate here.

Wheat closed 1-13 cents lower than Saturday, December \$1.36-\$1.36 1/2, May \$1.35 1/2-3; corn 1/2 lower to 1/4 higher, December 89 1/2, May 92 1/2; oats 1-1 off; rye 1-8 lower; soybeans unchanged to 1/4 off.

BOSTON WOOL

BOSTON, Dec. 21 (AP) (U. S. Dept. Agr.)—The Boston wool market continued quiet today. Purchases in Buenos Aires were reported in most grades finer than 44s. Uncertainties regarding shipping space limited sales to some extent. Sales of Australian top, both fine and half-blood, were made in small volume at prices six to eight cents below callings.

Oregon News Notes

Christmas shoppers' use of automobiles apparently has offset the effects of gasoline rationing in Portland, the city treasurer reporting a 5 1/2 per cent increase in parking meter revenues in the past week...

The Oregon defense council warned western Oregon residents it would be a violation of dim-out regulations to place a lighted candle in the window for Christmas...

The OPA granted Portland industrial sugar users a quota increase in recognition of a population gain... Oregon State college reported 1209 students have enrolled in reserves of the armed forces...

Seventy-eight men arrived at Camp Wickiup, former Deschutes river CCC camp, the first contingent of conscientious objectors from the middle west...

Production is expected to begin soon at the rebuilt M. G. Hitchcock mill at Sisters, destroyed by fire in August, and in the abandoned James Flanagan coal mine near Marshfield, which is being outfitted again...

At La Grande, Fred Lanning, 45-year-old barber hanged himself a few hours after accidentally wounding James O'Neal, about 70, on a duck-hunting trip. O'Neal was in a critical condition... The body of Ole Carlson, about 56, lumber grader, was found in his home at Redmond, and Sheriff C. L. McCauley said Carlson had shot himself...

WASHINGTON, Dec. 21 (AP)—The war production board today estimated lumber consumption in 1943 at approximately 31,000,000 board feet, compared with 40,200,000,000 board feet in 1942.

WPB set the lumber production goal for next year at 32,000,000,000 board feet, but said its attainment depended upon maintenance of present levels of manpower, tractors, trucks and flow of repair parts from the industry.

Work Program Outlined for Objectors' Camp

BAKER, Dec. 21 (AP)—Harry Fuller of the regional grazing office at Burns said Saturday that a work program has been outlined for conscientious objectors who will be assigned to a CCC camp at Keating.

Included in the labor program for next summer will be fire control, he said. Several thousand acres in the Keating area were burned over last summer. Fuller said his department has received no information as to when the first objectors will arrive at the camp.
