FREMONT COLLECTS FOR CAMP WHITE

Through the efforts of children of the seven grades of Fremont school and their parents, six huge cartons of furnishings for Camp White at Medford were collected and shipped to the camp just before the holidays, according to Augusta Parker, principal.

These furnishings are to aid in making the 50 day rooms for the soldiers more comfortable and homelike, and Miss Parker also expressed the school's appreciation to the Commandos for their suggestions on the list of desirable articles.

Among furnishings sent to camp were magazine racks and magazines, floor and reading lamps, bookends, vases, ornamental mantel pieces, books, candle holders, ash trays, end tables, tapestries, coat hangers, dollies, small rugs, pillows, wall pictures and a large mirror.

Miss Parker also stated that Fremont's seven grades and teachers have purchased nearly \$1800 in bonds and stamps since the fall term of school opened.

PATTERSON DENIES U. S. IMPERIALISM

CHARLOTTEVILLE, Va., Dec. 30 (AP)—Undersecretary of War Robert P. Patterson said today the army already has formulated plans for military government in occupied territories, but emphasized that such controls will be maintained only as long as made necessary by military reasons.

"We have no use for imperialism," he declared in a speech prepared for delivery at graduation exercises of the army's school of military government here. "When military necessity ceases and civilian government can take control, government by the military authority comes to an end."

BIDS TO OPEN ON HIGHWAY PROJECTS

SALEM, Dec. 30 (AP)—The state highway commission announced today it would open bids in Portland January 14 on six rock production projects.

Projects include: Klamath county: provide 8000 cubic yards of crushed rock on Crescent rock production project on The Dalles-California and Willamette highways.

Klamath county: provide 11,500 cubic yards of crushed rock on Chemult rock production project on The Dalles-California and Willamette highways.

Lane county: provide 14,400 cubic yards of crushed rock on Trent-Salt Creek falls rock production project on Willamette highway.

Foods to Be Rationed

WASHINGTON, Dec. 30 (AP)—Processed foods to be rationed in February, and commodities not included in the rationing order, as listed by the office of price administration, are:

Canned and bottled fruits and fruit juices (including spiced fruits).

Apples, including crabapples, applesauce, apricots, baby foods, berries, all varieties, cherries, red sour pitted, cherries, other, cranberries and sauce, fruits for salad and fruit cocktail, grapefruit juice, grape juice, peaches, pears, pineapple, pineapple juice, all other canned and bottled fruits, fruit juices, and combinations.

Canned and bottled vegetables and vegetable juices.

Asparagus, baby foods, beans, fresh lima beans, green and wax beans, all canned and bottled dry varieties, including baked beans, soaked dry beans, pork-and-beans, kidney beans and lentils; beets, including pickled; carrots, corn, peas, sauerkraut, spinach, tomatoes, tomato catsup and chili sauce, tomato juice, all other tomato products, all other canned and bottled vegetables, vegetable juices, and combinations.

Other processed foods. Canned soups, all types and varieties.

Dried, dehydrated fruits: prunes, raisins, all others. Frozen fruits: cherries, peaches, strawberries, other berries, all other frozen fruits.

Frozen vegetables: asparagus, beans, lima beans, green and wax, broccoli, corn, peas, spinach, all other frozen vegetables.

The following items are not included: Canned fruits, chill con carne, frozen fruits in containers over 10 pounds, frozen vegetables in containers over 10 pounds, fruit cakes, fruit juices in containers over one gallon, fruit puddings, jams, jellies, meat stews containing some vegetables, olives, paste products, (such as spaghetti, macaroni, noodles) whether or not they are packed with added vegetable sauces, pickles, potato salad, preserves, relishes, vegetable juices in containers over one gallon.

MOST LEADERS MAINTAIN EVEN BALANCE TODAY

By VICTOR EUBANK NEW YORK, Dec. 30 (AP)—Ralls and a few "blue chips" tried to pull stocks into higher ground today, most leaders managing to maintain better than an even balance despite a continuation of year-end adjustments.

Some sizeable blocks of stock were transferred, ranging to around 4000 shares and helping to boost turnover to about 1,100,000 shares for the full session.

Developments in the war apparently did not make much impression in the cross-currents of book balancing.

Carriers made about the best showing, progressing fractionally to around a point. There were some wider swings.
