33 INDICTED FOR ALLEGED CONSPIRACY

WASHINGTON, Jan. 5 (AP)—A federal grand jury yesterday indicted Mrs. Lois de Lafayette Washburn, Seattle, Wash., and Frank W. Clark, Tacoma, among 33 persons and the New York Evening Enquirer, Inc., for alleged conspiracy to undermine the morale of the armed forces.

The indictment is an enlargement of charges first brought by the justice department last July.
