JURY FORMED TO TRY ERROL FLYNN

LOS ANGELES, Jan. 11 (AP) — Selection of a jury to try Film Actor Errol Flynn on charges of statutory rape upon two teenage girls began in superior court today after Judge Leslie E. Still overruled a defense motion for a continuance because of the absence of a key defense witness.

Attorney Robert E. Ford, in seeking a continuance, declared that Hayward Kingsley, former captain of Flynn's yacht, Sirocco, now is in the navy and unavailable for testimony.

It was aboard the Sirocco that one of the plaintiffs, Peggy La Rue Satterlee, 16, Hollywood night club entertainer, charged the actor twice raped her while on a yachting trip to Santa Catalina Island in August, 1941.

At Flynn's recent preliminary hearing, Miss Satterlee testified she made no attempt to cry out at Flynn's alleged advances upon her because she figured her screams would not be heard by other guests because the vessel's machinery was making so much noise.

In asking for a continuance, Ford told the court that if Kingsley were here, he would testify that Flynn was at the wheel of the Sirocco throughout most of the cruise; and that from his own stateroom he would have been able to hear any sounds such as a woman's cry.

Flynn's second accuser is 17-year-old Betty Hansen, who left her Lincoln, Neb., home for Hollywood in hope she might eventually get movie roles.

WARREN OUSTS ENTIRE STATE HIGHWAY BOARD

SACRAMENTO, Jan. 11 (AP) — Governor Earl Warren today summarily ousted the entire state highway commission which had been appointed by former Gov. Culbert L. Olson.

Warren made the disclosure at a press conference, he said: "You have only to read the newspapers to know why I do not want Larry Barrett as chairman of the old commission, to represent this administration."

Formal Reason (Charges were filed recently with OPA accusing Barrett of violations of the tire rationing regulations, as operator of a garage in San Francisco.)

The formal reason given by Warren, however, was that the highway commission has scheduled a meeting for this week although it has been advised by Director Charles Purcell of the department of public works, there is no urgent business for the commission to transact.

Warren named members of his official staff as temporary members of the new highway commission. The permanent commission will be chosen within a few days.

ATLANTIC TOLL NOW STANDS AT 4000 SEAMEN

NEW YORK, Jan. 11 (AP) — The perilous task of sailing merchant ships in the submarine-infested Atlantic has taken the lives of at least 4000 and perhaps more than 6000 men since Pearl Harbor.

The announced destruction of six cargo vessels in the western Atlantic last week caused the loss of more seamen than had been reported in any previous week in several months, when the ship toll was higher.

Toll High There were indications that life would be still tougher for the sailors in the winter operations. Seamen stand less chance of survival after torpedoings in the cold months when they face heavy storms, icy waters and shorter hours of daylight.

Seventy-three men were killed and 87 were listed as missing as the result of six announced sinkings last week. These raised the casualty list for the 587 allied and neutral merchantmen reported sunk in the western Atlantic over the 6400 mark. At least 3908 men have been killed and 2521 others have been recorded as missing, with most of the latter considered lost.

The navy announced last night that 3211 merchant marine casualties—491 dead and 2720 missing—were reported from Sept. 27, 1941 to Dec. 21, 1942, resulting directly from enemy action against American ships only.
