MARKET TAKES FDR'S BUDGET TALK IN STRIDE

NEW YORK, Jan. 11 (AP)—The president's \$100,000,000 budget message was taken in stride by the stock market today and selected industrial, passed by steels, moved up fractions to around two points. Large blocks of low-quoted issues running to 10,000 shares for Packard motors, which edged into peak territory for 1942-43, propped volume. Transfers approximated 900,000 shares.

The picture of the nation's expenditures in 1943, biggest in history, contained virtually no element of surprise for Wall Street. Liggett & Myers "B" and American Tobacco "B" developed followings when opinions were expressed that sharply increased sales of the major manufacturers in this line would more than offset higher costs.

BOSTON WOOL

BOSTON, Jan. 11 (AP-USA)—Demand for scoured medium and half-blood foreign wools continued in the Boston wool market today. Good staple Santa Cruz secured 56s to 58s wools were sold at \$1.05 out of bond. Purchases were made in the primary market of Montevideo wools at a grease price of 33 to 34 cents. Some buying of Australian wools for importation was recorded.

WHEAT

CHICAGO, Jan. 11 (AP)—Independent strength of corn, which advanced as much as a cent a bushel to highs since 1937, supported the entire grain market today, checking a reaction in wheat, which lost almost a cent at times due to profit taking and hedging sales.

Good industrial demand for corn, with top grades of yellow grain selling as high as \$1.02 in the spot market, affected the market. Wheat's weakness reflected increased receipts at many terminals as a result of enlarged producer sales attracted by the highest prices in more than 5 years.

Corn closed unchanged to 1/2 cent higher compared with Saturday, May 99 1/2, July \$1.00-99 1/2; wheat 1-1/2 lower, May \$1.40 1/2, July \$1.41-1.41 1/2; oats 1-1/2 higher; soybeans 1/2 up; rye 1-1/2 higher.
