

# SNELL MESSAGE GETS APPROVAL; BILLS ON WAY

SALEM, Jan. 14 (AP)—Governor Earl Snell's recommendations to the legislature were given general approval by most legislators today, although several criticized his opposition to reduction of the state income tax.

Rep. Giles French, Moro, chairman of the house taxation and revenue committee, said his committee would begin work immediately on the tax phases of Snell's message. The committee will hire Guy Cordon, Roseburg tax expert, to assist. Cordon has been helping Snell in tax programs since last November.

French approved of Snell's tax program, but Senate President W. H. Steiwer, Fossil, agreed with all of it except the income tax recommendations.

SALEM, Jan. 14 (AP)—Sen. W. H. Strayer of Baker county introduced the first bill of the 1943 session yesterday after the senate's long battle to organize ended.

His bill provides that all money remaining from the \$15,000 appropriation for the Old Oregon Trail centennial be transferred to the state highway department.

Other bills introduced yesterday:

Sen. Lew Wallace, Multnomah—Providing that state income, corporate excise and intangibles taxes may be paid annually, semi-annually or monthly, with minimum payment fixed at \$10.

Sen. W. E. Burke, Yamhill—Requiring that all intoxicating liquor containing in excess of 14 per cent alcohol be sold exclusively by the state liquor control commission.

Sen. Thomas R. Mahoney, Multnomah—Providing abolition of the state milk control board and investing its duties with the state department of agriculture.

SALEM, Jan. 14 (AP)—The legislature's controversial tax problems were complicated even more today when Rep. Stanhope S. Pier, Portland, said he would introduce a memorial to ask congress to adopt the Ruml plan, calling for collection of federal income taxes on a pay-as-you-go basis.

SALEM, Jan. 14 (AP)—Two Democrats, Sens. Thomas R. Mahoney and Lew Wallace, both of Portland, beat the republicans to the punch in beginning to translate Governor Snell's legislative program into action.

Mahoney, who has led unsuccessful fights in the past two sessions to abolish milk control, introduced a bill to transfer the milk control board's functions to the state department of agriculture.

Wallace introduced a resolution providing that it be the policy of the state to guarantee all members of the armed forces their jobs when they come home from the war.

Both proposals were made by Snell in his opening message.

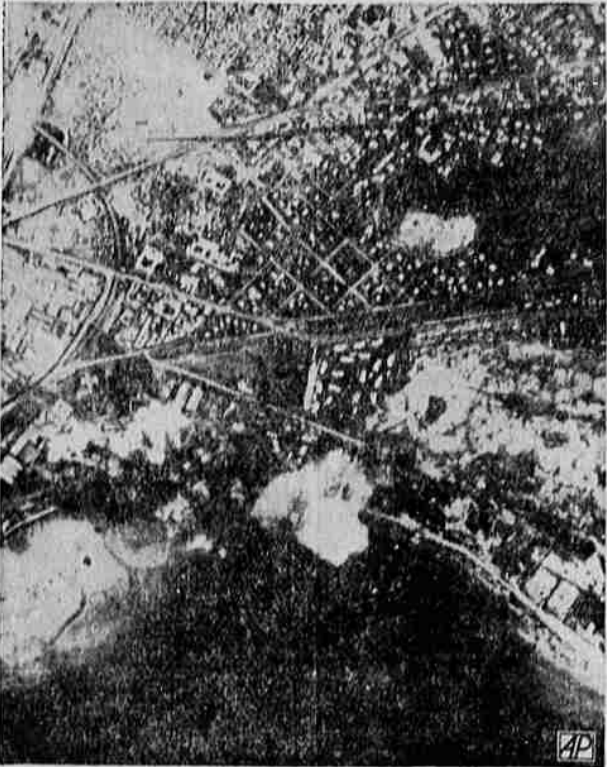
