DENVER, Jan. 16 (P) — A

spokesman for American cattle

producers called Friday for re-

organization of federal war

agencies and appointment of "a

tough boss" with a master plan

so the nation's agriculturists

will be able to produce enough

food for victory.

President Frank S. Boice of

the American National Live

Stock association declared such

action is necessary because:

"Food is a military weapon

of first importance and yet gov-

ernment officials do not seem

to realize what is happening in

the country. There are essen-

tial agricultural operations

everywhere being curtailed be-

cause of shortages of manpower,

rubber and farm machinery and

supplies."
