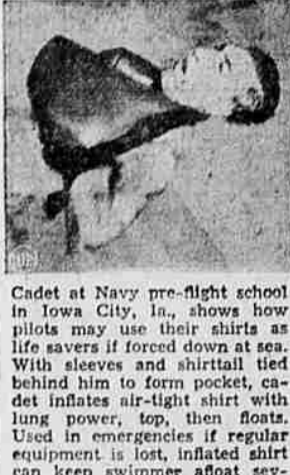

NEW YORK, Jan. 21 (AP)—Under the leadership of steels, motors and other selected industrials, the stock market turned around today and pushed up fractions to a point or so generally with isolated issues jumping as much as 4.

The last-minute come-back of Wednesday was extended moderately at the opening in sluggish dealings. Buyers then became more confident and activity quickened after mid-day. Closing prices were at or near the best of the session. Rails and utilities were relatively narrow although most were up small amounts.
