## MITCHELMORES HERE TO TAKE KLAMATH POST

Rev. Hugh T. Mitchelmore who, with Mrs. Mitchelmore, has come to Klamath Falls to become pastor of the Altamont Community Presbyterian and the Mt. Laki churches, was pastor of the Presbyterian church at Ashland for over seven years before returning to Spokane to become pastor of the Manito Presbyterian church. After the fire at Bandon he returned to Oregon and was instrumental in building a church and manse valued at \$7000, dedicated free of debt. During this time the membership of the church was doubled. Living at Myrtle Point during construction he drove over a thousand miles a month.

Mr. Mitchelmore came to Klamath Falls from Myrtle Point where he was a member of Rotary and its chaplain and was also active in the chamber of commerce. Mr. Mitchelmore has just retired as chairman of the committee on pensions of the Synod of Oregon, the state organization of the Presbyterian church, after serving six years, the constitutional limit. He is at present chairman of the committee on Christian Education and on Young People's conference, and permanent clerk of the Presbytery of Southwest Oregon which is composed of the seven southern counties.

Mrs. Mitchelmore is an accomplished musician, pianist, organist, director of choir and orchestra, with professional experience in Seattle and Spokane, Washington. She is also active in work with young people and in missionary organizations.

Rev. Lawrence H. Mitchelmore, who was pastor of the Presbyterian church at Merrill for three years and is now at Jacksonville and Phoenix, Ore., is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Hugh T. Mitchelmore.
