Doctor Cunningham Sees Four-Minute Mile Soon

One-Time 'King of Milers' Looks Over Crop of Milers; Impressed by Haegg

MT. VERNON, Ia., Jan. 29 (AP)—Dr. Glenn Cunningham, whose sinewy legs carried him over the mile route faster than any other runner, believes that the four-minute mile will be accomplished in the "not too distant future."

The one-time "king of the milers," now director of athletics at Cornell college, said today that "some fast man among those coming up now will shade four minutes."

Glenn missed the ultimate goal of all milers, but his 4:04.4 mark in a special race at Dartmouth in 1938 is the lowest in track history. It was not recognized, however, as a world mark because he was paced during the race on a special indoor board track.

Cunningham, discussing the present crop of milers, said he is impressed by the records reported on Gunder Haegg, the 24-year-old Swedish fireman whose 4:04.6 mark recently was accepted as the world outdoor record.

Although he thinks Gilbert Dodds, the Boston theologian, is erratic, probably because of psychological reasons, Cunningham said Dodds' 4:13 race in the Sugar bowl competition was fast for this time of the year.

"Maybe he can yet uncock the stem-winder," Glenn added. The "stem-winder" is largely a matter of psychology in Cunningham's opinion.

"The first man who runs a four-minute mile will have to believe he can do it," he declared.

"The right ingredients are speed, endurance, pace-judgment and intestinal fortitude, together with the psychological conviction of the runner that that is the day on which he can break the tape in record time," Cunningham explained.

"There cannot be too much jockeying for position in the four-minute performance. But it will be a competitive race. A man will have to be crowded to make it."

Although retired from active competition, the former Kansas flyer continues as regular a routine of training as circumstances permit.

During the cross-country season Glenn legged it over the roads with the Cornell harriers. There isn't another 4:04.4 mile in those famous legs, but the college boys still have to hustle to keep up with them.

Medford Star Athlete Killed In North Africa

MEDFORD, Jan. 29 (AP)—News of the death of Lieut. Robert B. Olson, former Oregon State college football star, has been received here by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. H. V. Olson.

The 24-year-old flier's wife in San Francisco said she had been informed officially of his death in North Africa about a week ago.

Olson was a standout for Medford high school in 1937 before going to Oregon State.
