WHEAT

CHICAGO, Feb. 10 (AP)—Wheat prices held firm today, giving support to other grains, as a fair amount of commission house buying entered the market following a drop in the first few minutes of trading.

Over-night selling orders, apparently caused by unfavorable interpretations of Economic Stabilization Director James Byrnes' speech last night, caused an early sell off of 1 cent in wheat. At \$1.39 for the May contract, however, good support was uncovered and prices soon rallied above the preceding close.

Wheat maintained small fractional gains throughout the session, and the close was at the day's high. The bread cereal finished 1/4c higher, May \$1.391-1.40, July \$1.391-1.40, corn was 1/4c up, May 97 1/2c, oats were unchanged to 1c higher, rye finished 1/4c lower to 1c higher and there was no trade in soybeans.

BOSTON WOOL
BOSTON, Feb. 10 (AP-USA)—The Boston wool market was generally quiet today. Purchasing of straggling lots of old wool was reported from the country at unchanged prices. Lambs wool from the mid-west was sold at a gross price of 44 cents for a lot of medium wool shrinking 51 to 52 per cent. Some interest was shown in South American spot wools for spinning yarns.

STOCK MARKET

HAS BIGGEST DAY OF 1943

NEW YORK, Feb. 10 (AP)—Stock prices advanced today in a market highlighted by blocks of lower-priced shares and a belated rally by steels.

Dealings in amusements, utilities and a few specialties—many near or under the \$10 class—swelled volume past the million-share mark for the sixth session this year, to about 1,500,000 for the biggest day of 1943.

Encouraging interpretations of war news helped sentiment. Mixed reaction was accorded the order decreeing a 48-hour work week for many industrial areas. The tendency of investors was to await further implementation of this and of wage decisions before using it as a basis for commitments.
