MANY STOCKS HIT TWO-YEAR PEAK LEVELS

NEW YORK, Feb. 25 (AP)—In one of the broadest and speediest markets for many months, numerous stocks today climbed to peak levels in more than two years.
Heavy buying continued in low-priced utilities and other categories and volume for the full proceedings was not far from the 2,000,000-share figure, or the largest since late December, 1941. There were intermittent slow-downs after the opening and top gains ranging from fractions to 2 points or so were reduced near the close. Losers were relatively meager.
The further upswing again was attributed by brokers mainly to encouragement over Russian battle victories, persistent talk of inflation, pressure of idle funds and brightening of hopes for favorable economic legislation by congress.
