MARKET TAKES TIME OUT TO CASH PROFITS

NEW YORK, Feb. 16 (P)—The stock market took time out today to accommodate customers who converted part of their paper profits to cash in the wake of Monday's advance to the highest average level in more than two years. Declines of fractions to a point or so ruled from the start. It was the first setback since February 8. Offerings were never urgent and, while dealings topped the 1,000,000-share mark, they were relatively slow when stacked up against the previous 1,835,840 total, largest since December, 1941. Good war news from Russia and the Solomons helped offset cloudy dispatches from Tunisia. Inflation ideas continued as a bolstering factor. WHEAT
CHICAGO, Feb. 16 (P)—Wheat futures prices skyrocketed to new seasonal highs today and other grains advanced in sympathy. The upturn was associated with congressional developments and with an announcement that the Commodity Credit Corporation had ordered sales of government owned wheat for livestock feed limited because supplies were running low. The CCC said of the 125,000 bushels of wheat authorized for sale as feed at 85 percent of the corn parity price, more than 100,000,000 bushels had been disposed of and further sales were limited pending the determination of the amount committed under unfilled sales. Wheat advances amounted to as much as 1 1/2 cents and rye to 2 1/2 cents at the extreme. Wheat closed 1 1/2 to 2 cents above yesterday's final prices. May and July 51.41-4; September 51.42-1; corn rose 1/4 to 1, May 99 1/4; rye 1.00; oats were 1/4 to 1/2 higher; July 2 to 2 1/2 and soybeans gained 1 cent.
