RAILS SPARK LATE RISE ON DAY'S MARKET

NEW YORK, Feb. 17 (AP) - Volumes attained fairly large figures again in today's stock market and prices showed a gradual hardening after early irregularity, with rails leading the upturn.

Moderate improvement near the close was in the face of more adverse news from the Tunisian front, which had an offset however, in the bright reports from Russia.

Active transactions in low priced shares helped to lift turnover for the five hours to around a million shares.

Revival of the carriers brought gains of fractions to around a point and followed word from Chicago to termination of wage negotiations between management and rail unions without agreement.
