'SERVICE FOR SERVICE MEN' PLANNED HERE

"A service for service men" has been planned for Sunday night at the First Baptist church, Eighth and Washington streets, according to an announcement by the pastor, the Rev. C. C. Brown.

Mr. Brown states that once a month the church honors and remembers all the men of the church families with a patriotic service. This service has become very popular with the community and has found a warm response in the hearts of the men in the armed forces, many of whom have written letters of deep appreciation to the pastor. A regular system of correspondence between the service men and the church has been established through the pastor, and the Rev. Brown says that this has come to be one of the most delightful phases of his ministry.
