Point Ration Information

If you're worrying about point rationing, here are a few ideas that will help you. You have your War Ration Book No. 2... one for each member of your family. Have you clipped the point value charts from the newspapers? You should and you'll find it will save you time, money and points if you study them at home.

While it's not easy to plan a week's menu complete in every detail, still, do the best you can, the same as you've always done. Now look over your point ration chart and after each rationed item write its point value and see how you're making out. Notice the low point items. These are products which are the most plentiful and will make your points go farther.

If your total number of points is more than your weekly point allowance, better change your menu, and substitute non-rationed fresh fruits and vegetables, or a bowl of homemade soup instead of canned. And if you must use some foods over and over again, vary them by looking up new recipes.

Don't look on the gloomy side... we still have several hundred food items that are not rationed... from which to build good-tasting, nutritious meals. We'll get used to this idea in no time, just as we did with sugar, coffee and gasoline rationing.

Coffee-Wise

In coffee, it's quality rather than quantity that counts. That's why the coffee-wise are making sure that every cup of coffee they serve offers the very best there is in coffee... flavor, aroma, inspiration and sheer taste joy.

To make every cup a super one, choose the brand carefully, make the coffee with meticulous care, and drink it slowly, musing over its goodness. One really delicious cup of coffee is worth any number of inferior cups.

BUYING COFFEE—Get your coffee only as you need it, and your coffee will be fresher. Always be certain to get the right grind for your method of brewing coffee.

Regular Grind for percolator or for boiling... **Drip Grind** for drip and vacuum makers. To hold its fragrance and flavor, keep your coffee in a tightly covered can or jar. If bought in packages or bags, pour it into a canister or fruit jar and keep covered.

A CLEAN POT pays dividends in flavor. Scrub yours well so that there are no specks of old coffee lurking in the basket or in the sides of the pot.

MEASURE ACCURATELY both the coffee and the water, and use standard measures for uniform results. For average coffee strength we suggest 1 1/2 to 2 level tablespoons of coffee for each standard measuring cup of water. (A standard measuring cup equals from 1 1/2 to 1 3/4 dinner cups.) However the quantity of coffee to use depends on how strong you like it. You'll not get as good results if you use a large pot for a small amount of coffee. If you want only a small amount of coffee, make it in a sauce pan using the good old-fashioned boiled method. Avoid leftover coffee.

Percolator Coffee—Use either hot or cold water. Start timing when the "perk" begins and "perk" slowly for 7 to 10 minutes.

Boiled Coffee—Add coffee to cold water in pot or sauce pan, let it come to a rolling boil, remove from heat and allow a few minutes for the grounds to settle. Strain and serve.

Drip Coffee—Pre-heat pot and allow to drip slowly through the coffee. The dripping time should take from 6 to 8 minutes to obtain the peak of flavor and aroma.

Vacuum Coffee—Have water in lower bowl boiling before fitting upper bowl in place. Begin timing when the water rises and comes in contact with the coffee. Control the heat so that the coffee and water are infused together in from 5 to 7 minutes.
