WHEAT CHICAGO, March 9 (AP)—Action of the house rules committee in approving the Pace bill, which would provide that farm labor costs be included in computing parity prices, brought about a moderate rally in wheat during the closing hour today, but traders said this action had been largely discounted. The general undertone continued easier, however, and wheat closed near the lows for the day. Rye and oats were in limited demand and prices sold off sympathy with wheat. Corn was bid at the ceilings. Wheat closed 1 to 1 1/2 cents under yesterday's final levels, May \$1.46 1/2; July \$1.47 1/2; corn was bid at ceiling limits; oats were unchanged on the current delivery at 1c lower on deferred contracts and rye was 1-1/2 cents lower.
