Replacing a \$100,000,000 incentive payment program previously proposed by Agriculture Secretary Wickerd but blocked by congressional farm blocked Secretary wickers but blocked by congressional farm bloc op-position, the support prices for dry beans, dry peas, peanuts, soybeans and flaxseeds will be established through purchase and loan operations of the com-

modity credit corporation.

In addition, funds already available will be used for incentive payments at rates previously announced by Wickard on po-tatoes, carrots, snap beans, lima beans, beets, tomatoes, cabbage, onions and green peas. Five Vital Crops

The five crops for which high-er prices have been pledged are regarded as vital to the war food program because they yield veg-etable food oils and livestock
