EXPERIMENTS WITH PLANTING

Weyerhaeuser Timber com pany here is experimenting with methods of establishing ponderosa pine artificially in those areas where it has failed to come in naturally after cutting, it was learned Saturday. This was described as a part of the com-pany's practice of managing lands to produce a continuous forest crop

The best known method of doing this is to plant small trees.
This process is laborious and expensive, and virtually out of the question when labor is needed for war work and cannot be spared for activities of this na-

A somewhat cheaper method is to plant seed directly. Succontrolling the large numbers of seed-eating rodents that are present throughout this area. Evidently these rodents are always hungry, for earlier trials of direct seeding have failed due to the complete loss of seeds to the appetites of these little ani-

The Modoc council of Boy Scouts of America requested two small-scale experiments in forestry as work projects for the acouts About 3000 two-year-old trees were planted along Greensprings highway, and immedi-ately opposite this planting site 400 seed spots were set out to test the feasibility of this method of establishing forests.

Direct seeding plots are for ponderosa pine only, but the trial planting included Douglas fir and Austrian pine, as well as ponderosa. About 30 scouts participated in the experiments. Planting stock was secured through the state nursery at Sa-

It is the intention of Weyerhaeuser company to continue these small-scale experiments in seeding and planting until feasible field methods of regenera-tion are discovered, company of-
