

TRAGEDY HITS EX-RESIDENTS OF KLAMATH

Former Klamath residents figured in a tragedy which occurred Thursday, May 6, at Riverton, Wyoming.

Mr. and Mrs. Lee Sutton of Midland received word of the death of six-month-old Jerry Sutton, youngest son of Pvt. and Mrs. James Sutton, and the child's grandmother, Mrs. C. E. Lawson, when the Lawson home was burned.

Mrs. James Sutton and C. E. Lawson suffered severe burns. Funeral services were held in Riverton this past Tuesday. Details of the fire had not reached Lee Sutton, foster father of Pvt. Sutton.

Friends here remember Mrs. James Sutton as Valera Bridges, daughter of Manuel Bridges, now living in Los Angeles but a former Klamath resident.

Fire Destroys Fish Storage, Packing Plant at Gobie

ST. HELENS, Ore., May 13 (AP)—Fire of undetermined origin last night destroyed the old cold storage and fish-packing plant, and two tool houses of the S. P. & S. railroad at Gobie, Ore., on the Columbia river about 15 miles north of here.

Favorable wind saved the wood steambot, S. S. Culburra, anchored nearby. A coastguard crew from Longview saved the adjoining docks.

Besson Assumes Command of Camp Abbot Near Bend

BEND, May 13 (AP)—Col. Frank S. Besson has assumed command of Camp Abbot, new army engineer replacement center near here.

Besson, a West Pointer who saw active duty in France during the last war as an engineer officer, came here from Fort Leonard Wood, Mo., where he also commanded an engineer replacement center.

One of his two sons now is a prisoner of the Japanese.

WPB Reports High War Expenditures

WASHINGTON, May 13 (AP)—War expenditures reached a new high of \$7,200,000,000 in April, the war production board reported today.

This brought war expenditures since July, 1942, to \$94,900,000,000.

April expenditures exceeded those in March by \$178,000,000, or three per cent.

The figures include expenditures by the treasury, reconstruction finance corporation and RFC subsidiaries for all war purposes.
