

COMMANDO UNIT TO BRING FOUR MARINES HERE

The Klamath Commandos are bringing four more wounded marines, wounded in combat duty, to Klamath Falls next Monday, May 17th. These young men will all be brought here from the U. S. Naval hospital at Mare Island, Calif. All four marines will be guests of Mr. and Mrs. Leslie Rogers, 851 Pacific Terrace, while here. Mr. and Mrs. Rogers have two sons overseas at this time, one a marine and the other in the U. S. air corps.

The Commandos and Klamath Falls are getting a great deal of fine publicity for their project of bringing wounded service men to Klamath Falls. Newspapers throughout the United States are using this project to encourage and suggest to other cities to do what this city is doing in entertaining wounded service men from our army and navy hospitals. Recently a Norfolk, Virginia, newspaper carried an article along this line, about the Commandos. The Vallejo, Calif., newspaper recently ran the following article:

"Well, there's no better opportunity than that offered by Mrs. Ruth Tait, Red Cross recreation director at Mare Island hospital, who will help you if you wish to entertain a disabled or convalescent sailor or marine in your home. Just telephone her at Local 4132 and tell her where you live, when you want your guests and for how long, how many you wish to invite, and she'll do the rest.

"She'll ask you a few questions which will guide her in making her choice of your guests. She'll try to choose guests whose interests will be the same as yours. You can help her if you tell her what you have to offer, such as golf, tennis, music, parties or just a chance to relax in a real, 'homey' home.

"You can invite boys for dinner or for whole weekends. If you can't come to the hospital in your car to get your guests, send bus or train tickets to Mrs. Tait or send a check to cover expenses.

"You will feel much happier in knowing you have been able to help over a very 'rough spot' these fine boys who have done so much for us. They deserve the best we can offer.

"Just to show what some generous-hearted people are doing in cities far from Mare Island, here's the story of the 'Commandos,' a young woman's service club in Klamath Falls, Ore. The 'Commandos' have undertaken the project of entertaining service men from different hospitals, paying all their expenses to Klamath Falls and back. They recently sent a check for \$180 to Mrs. Tait, asking for six men for five days.
