

ENEMY CAUGHT IN CHICHAGOF HARBOR AREA

(Continued From Page One) United States light surface forces assisted in clearing the Holtz Bay-Massacre Bay pass of enemy troops.

On May 18th: (A) United States forces captured Sarana pass leading to the Chichagof area.

Chichagof Hit (B) A force of U. S. army bombers attacked military objectives in the Chichagof harbor area.

U. S. forces are now in possession of the runway in the Holtz Bay area.

South Pacific (all dates are east longitude): On May 18th during the night, Japanese bombers attacked U. S. positions on Guadalcanal island and in the Russell Islands.

(Continued From Page One) Russian troops had launched sharp attacks on German lines in the Staraya Russa sector near Lake Ilmen, south of Volkovo, and near Orel and Belgorod.

The German high command in its communique today also gave no support to the claims, confining its report on the Russian fighting to the bare statement that yesterday on the whole passed without special events on the eastern front.

Russian Moves Told (The Tribune De Geneve, in Switzerland, also carried a Berlin dispatch quoting German military circles as saying the Russians were developing big troop movements in the Taman peninsula of the Caucasus, above Kursk and south of Leningrad.)

Air Battles Fighters and bombers, with the red air force holding superiority, continued major scale battles in the sky.

Lawmakers Okay Big Construction Of Landing Craft WASHINGTON, May 20 (AP)—Construction of 1,000,000 tons of landing craft for invasion operations is authorized by legislation passed by the senate today and sent to the White House.

The senate also amended and returned to the house another measure authorizing the acquisition, conversion or construction of 1,000,000 tons of auxiliary naval vessels, such as tankers, repair vessels, transports and hospital ships.

Cost of the landing boat program was estimated at \$1,700,000,000, while the auxiliary ship outlay was reckoned at \$1,238,100,000.

Senate Confirms Lear Promotion WASHINGTON, May 20 (AP)—Over the vigorous objection of Senator Clark (D-Mo.) the senate confirmed today President Roosevelt's advancement of Ben Lear to the temporary rank of major general in the army.

Lear protested that General Lear had violated the articles of war in punishing by a forced march a 35th division truck train detachment because some soldiers had "yoo-hoed" to girls on a golf course at Memphis, Tenn.

CREWS FIGHT RISING FLOODS IN MIDWEST

(Continued From Page One) two feet in the next 24 hours. The all-time peak at St. Louis was 41.2 feet in 1844, Alexander said.

Slight Relief There was only slight measure of relief in the flooded area in a six-state mid-continent section where surging waters have driven thousands from their homes; covered millions of acres of farm lands; caused disruption of rail and motor traffic, and halted work in many war plants and factories.

The number of dead in the flooded area was 10, six in Indiana, three in Missouri and one in Oklahoma, while the estimated number of persons driven from their homes was more than 22,000 — including 12,000 in Indiana and 10,000 in Illinois.

Guffey Coal Act Extension Passes Senate; to House WASHINGTON, May 20 (AP)—Legislation extending the Guffey coal act from May 23 to August 23 was passed unanimously by the senate today and sent to the White House.

The action came after an administration warning that failure to continue the bituminous coal commission might imperil efforts to settle the soft coal wage controversy and make government operation of the mines "practically impossible."

Meat Packers Protest Subsidies To Processors

WASHINGTON, May 20 (AP)—The National Independent Meat Packers association protested today that the administration's program to grant subsidies to meat processors in order to cut consumer costs "will not in the slightest degree alleviate the price squeeze."

Wilbur Laro Jr., the organization's general counsel, told the house committee on small business that the subsidy "is to be limited to the additional 10 per cent reduction" contemplated under the plan to roll back meat prices 10 per cent.

"In other words," he argued, while saying that inability to obtain meat is forcing out of business scores of independent packers, "our members are to obtain no subsidy for that part of the price squeeze which already exists."

Molotov Receives FDR's Personal Mailman Today

LONDON, May 20 (AP)—Soviet Foreign Commissar Molotov today received Joseph E. Davies, who is in Moscow to deliver a personal letter from President Roosevelt to Premier Stalin, the Moscow radio announced tonight in a broadcast recorded by the soviet monitor.

The U. S. ambassador, William H. Standley, was present at the meeting, said the broadcast. The Roosevelt letter to Stalin was not mentioned.
