Treasure Island Slated for Navy Base After War

SAN FRANCISCO, May 20 (AP)—Treasure Island in San Francisco bay will be the permanent Pacific coast base of the United States navy after the war, the board of supervisors was informed yesterday.

Major Thornton Wilson, USMC, legal aide to Admiral

John W. Greenslade, commandant of the 12th naval district, appearing before the board to urge it to abandon efforts to regain title to the island, recently taken over by the navy said: "Whether you like it or not, you are going to have the navy at Treasure Island when the war is over."

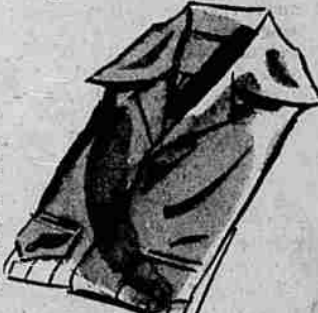
