

KUHS SERVICE MEN HONORED BY DISPLAY

A display appropriate to 1943's Memorial Day is arranged in the window of Kennell-Ellis studio at the corner of Eighth and Main streets, honoring the 285 boys of Klamath Union high school, who are in this country's armed services.

As many pictures as possible were obtained for the display, some from the studio's files and some copies of borrowed photographs obtained from parents, showing their boys in uniform.

Catherine Gaylord Brumbaugh, owner of the studio, desires that it be understood that all the photographs are not from Kennell-Ellis, and she stated that the studio staff tried to contact the parents of each boy in order to obtain a late picture wherever possible, but that they were unable to locate some of the parents.

Over 240 of the KUHS boys of '39, '40, '41, '42 and '43 are represented in the display which will remain in the window a week or ten days. Kennell-Ellis was unable to obtain photos of the remainder, according to Mrs. Brumbaugh.

ARMY ANNOUNCES CASUALTY TOTALS

WASHINGTON, May 27 (AP)—American army casualties in North Africa from November 8 to May 15 totaled 2184 killed, 9437 wounded and 6937 missing or prisoners, Secretary of War Stimson said today.

Total allied casualties in the Tunisian campaign, including British and French figures not reported in detail, were "less than 70,000," Stimson said. By contrast, he said, the axis lost 30,000 killed, 26,400 wounded and 266,600 prisoners.

Richard Newman Gets Scholarship To Oregon State

OREGON STATE COLLEGE Richard Carl Newman of Klamath Falls is one of 89 high school students receiving Oregon state board of higher education scholarships to attend Oregon State college next fall.

He was recommended highly for this scholarship by S. D. Woodruff, principal of Klamath Union high school.

Newman plans to major in engineering at Oregon State, a course which is vitally important for war training. He is also a member of the Hi-Y, and took part in high school radio programs.

SEATTLE, May 27 (AP)—The regional war labor board's wage increase decision in the case of workers in canneries and other food processing plants in the Puget Sound, Vancouver and Portland areas was protested yesterday by the Washington State Council of Cannery unions.

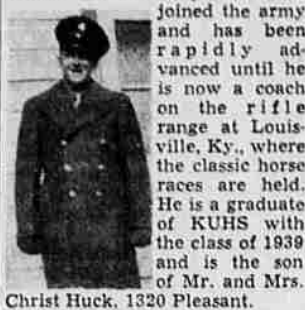

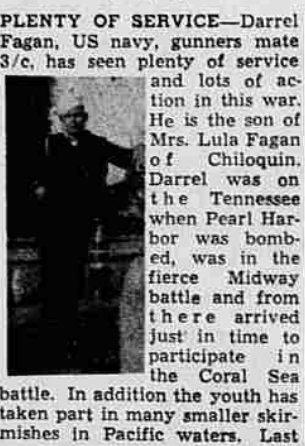
