MACHINISTS BREAK FROM AFL IN FIGHT

WASHINGTON, May 27 (AP)—The International Association of Machinists with a reputed membership well over half a million, announced today it is quitting the American Federation of Labor as of May 31 because of a long standing jurisdictional row.

The AFL thus lost almost the same numerical strength it stands to gain by the prospective readmittance of John L. Lewis' United Mine Workers.

The jurisdictional fight involves chiefly William L. Hutcheson's Carpenters union, which the machinists contend has been "muscling in" on its field with the sanction of the AFL executive council.

Machinists' President Harvey W. Brown said the break after 48 years' affiliation is regrettable, but "if we are going to continue to get a beating we are not going to pay for it."

The Machinists' per capita tax payments to the AFL have averaged about \$60,000 a year. The union has been growing rapidly, however, because of organization in the aircraft field and tax

payments on the full, claimed membership would substantially exceed \$60,000.

Brown said the IAM would remain independent, "with the hope that the machinists will be given the same consideration as other unions."

Park Service Gives Up Diamond Lake Addition to Areas

WASHINGTON, May 27 (AP)—The national park service, says

Director Newton B. Drury, has no plans for seeking to bring new areas under its jurisdiction.

Drury made this plain yesterday to the house public lands committee, which is studying a bill to nullify President Roosevelt's action in creating the Jackson Hole national monument in Wyoming by proclamation. Rep. Mott (R-Ore.), had asked whether the park service had "other such schemes affecting other areas."

When Mott asked particularly about the possibility of adding Diamond lake to Crater Lake national park, the director replied: "We have given that up."
