Jacobsen, on behalf of the Royal Norwegian Information services is making a nationwide tour to stimulate interest in civilian defense.

When the Germans invaded Norway in April, 1940, Jacobsen, on the staff of Mrs. Daisy Har-riman, U. S. minister to Norway, helped evacuate Americans from Norway.

In December, 1940, he was transferred to the U.S. embassy at Moscow, but when he reached the Swedish border, the Gestapo nabbed him and sent him to Mollergaten No. 19.
