# BRITAIN LISTS CASUALTIES IN THREE YEARS

LONDON, June 1 (P)-Britain has suffered 514,993 casualties in all ranks of empire armed forces in the first three years of war, Deputy Prime Minister Clement Attlee told commons today.

Attlee said 92,089 had been killed; 226,719 were missing; 107,891 were prisoners of war and 88,294 were wounded.




