OATS, RYE SLUMP IN CHICAGO TRADE

CHICAGO, June 14 (AP)—Persistent selling entered grain pits today and wheat, oats and rye slumped more than a cent at times in a market which displayed a substantial drying-up of buying power. Profit-taking appeared in oats and rye, while wheat ran into hedging pressure.

Large wheat receipts at Kansas City and Minneapolis had a depressing influence on trading sentiment. Little attention was paid to a decline of 4,582,000 bushels in the visible supply last week, leaving total supply at 135,205,000 bushels against 184,202,000 bushels last year.
